THE KINDILINK PROGRAM

KindiLink is a play and learn initiative for families offered to children 0- 3 years and their parent/caregivers. The aim is to enhance each child's learning while building families' capabilities and confidence as their child's first educator.

The Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF), the Kindergarten Curriculum Guidelines (SCASA) and the West Australian Curriculum clarify what we expect students to achieve in the Early years. At Beachlands Primary School we have high expectations of student achievement in their first years of schooling. We focus on developing social skills and school readiness through intentional play-based learning experiences.

At least one adult needs to attend each KindiLink session with their child (and they must remain with them for the entire session as supervision of their child is their responsibility).
