



Our Program


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The Kindy teaching and learning program is based on the National Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) –"Belonging, Being & Becoming".



Our program strives to be child-centred, balanced, relevant, and interesting. The EYLF, Kindy Curriculum Guidelines (SCSA) and the West

Australian Curriculum outline what we expect students to achieve in the early years.



At Beachlands Primary School, we focus on developing literacy, numeracy and social skills through adult-guided and play-based learning experiences.



Our goal is to provide an exciting program that allows children to learn through relevant and meaningful experiences that cater for different learning styles and levels of development.

Our Pedagogy

Play-based learning with elements of explicit instruction and evidence-based instruction sees our Kindergarten teachers carefully plan learning programs that make connections between experiences, concepts and processes.

Kindergarten will be an opportunity for your child to learn through both play-based and adult-guided experiences inside and outside the classroom.





A play-based learning environment encourages self motivation, critical thinking, problem solving and getting along with others. Solid foundations for future success and life-long learning.

When learning through play, your child sees literacy and numeracy as part of their everyday experience.




Play Based Learning

Our teachers provide intentional play-based learning through handson opportunities to construct knowledge, build vocabulary, and develop personal and social skills so the children can:

- see themselves as capable and competent learners
- learn new concepts and skills
- express their individuality
- develop a sense of identity and well-being
- enhance their curiosity and creativity
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ build relationships and resilience
- \cdot experience and understand difference and diversity
- make connections between prior experiences and new learning.

Your role as a parent or carer...

- I will bring my child to school regularly
- I will arrive at school by 8:50 am
- I will pack a healthy lunchbox each day
- I will pack a water bottle each day
- My child will have a good sleep routine
- I may volunteer in my child's class
- I will always speak positively about school
- I will connect to your child's class Seesaw account



- I will speak with my child's class teacher if you have any concerns
- I will engage in conversation with my child about their learning
- I will notify the office of any emergency contact information changes
- I will notify the teacher if my child is receiving any therapies outside of

school including speech or occupational therapy

• I will notify the teacher of any changes in normal routine at home.

Drop-off & Pick-up

Please accompany your child to the door of their classroom and wait with them until the doors open at 8:30 am. To avoid your child becoming stressed or anxious, please ensure that your child arrives on time and is collected promptly at 3:00 pm. Parents and caregivers are welcome to join in during the morning activities; however, the staff will also support children in developing their independence.

Children aren't permitted to leave until a parent or adult comes to the door to collect them. Please advise the school if your child will be collected by someone other than yourself. We are not able to release students to adults who aren't on your child's contact list without your approval.

Children who arrive late for school are required to sign in at the front office. If you need to collect your child earlier than 3:00 pm, please go to the front office to sign out before collecting them from the classroom.

If you are unable to organise transportation for your child to school, we

offer a bus service to pick up students on a needs basis. Please see Administration for further information.






Attendance

Once you have enrolled your child, they are required to attend three days per week (Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday).

Regular attendance will ensure your child gains the most from this critical year of child development.





Illnesses

Absences

Please inform us if you intend to keep your child at home. This can be done by calling the school on: 9923 6900 or email Beachlands.ps@education.wa.edu.au

Please let us know if your child is ill or is to be away for any other reason. Please notify the staff if your child contracts an infectious disease that may affect their participation.

While your child may still want to come to school, please keep them home for a minimum of 24 hours.

Keep in touch with the teacher on matters concerning health and wellbeing. A change at home in your child's routine may often impact their happiness at school.



Communicable Diseases

If your child is unwell, they should not attend school. Some illnesses require an exclusion period from school. Please keep your child home if they are experiencing any of the following:

- Live head lice
- Fever
- Weeping sores
- Diarrhoea or vomiting (do not attend school until 24 to 48 hours after it has ceased)
- Any infectious diseases e.g. influenza, measles, chickenpox, whooping cough, school sores, COVID-19



Healthy Eating Options

KindiLink Program

KindiLink is a play and learn initiative for families offered to children 0– 3 years and their parent/caregivers. The aim is to enhance each child's learning while building families' capabilities and confidence as their child's first educator.

At Beachlands Primary School we have high expectations of student achievement in their first years of schooling. We focus on developing social skills and school readiness through intentional play-based learning experiences.

Session times: Tuesday and Wednesday 9am- 12pm

KindiLink Outcomes

- Better school preparedness
- Better school engagement by both children and families
- Better rates of school attendance across all years of future schooling
- Improved personal and social learning
- Improved literacy and numeracy performance
